

**Behaviour Policy Addendum****COVID-19**

At Southwold Primary and Nursery school, we believe in providing a safe, welcoming, happy, calm and purposeful environment in which children can learn effectively and share how they feel.

All pupils should continue to adhere to the principles outlined in the school's Behaviour Policy.

**In addition children and staff should:**

Respect the revised day-to-day expectations of the class 'bubbles' and wider school

- Staff will make sure they explain all of the revised day-to-day expectations of the 'bubbles' and the wider school so that the children understand what is expected of them
- Children should adhere to the revised rules and expectations for entering and exiting the school site
- Children should stay in their own rooms unless directed otherwise
- Children should only interact with others in their own bubble throughout the school day
- Children should only use their designated entrance and exits to the school building
- Children should stay at their own desks unless directed otherwise
- Children should obey social distancing rules at all times, in and out of the class bubble - children should follow hygiene rules, including washing hands when asked to throughout the day

Be aware of, and follow, expected Self-Care and Health needs

- Children should inform an adult if they feel they have any Covid-19 symptoms (symptoms will be shared with children)
- Children should use tissues when sneezing or coughing and dispose of in the bins provided
- Children should only go to the toilet areas one at a time and thoroughly wash their hands after use (at least 20 seconds)
- Children should only use their own resource packs, not interfering or touching any others resources or equipment
- All items used in the class bubble should be cleaned and sanitised after use e.g. lunchtimes and end of school day
- Children should only use their own water bottles and eat/drink their own food. No sharing is allowed
- Children will not bring any additional items into school other than lunch boxes, water bottles, clothing, hats and sun cream. Sun cream must be applied by the child/family before arriving in school.

## **Rewards and Sanctions**

### **Rewards**

Please continue as the behaviour policy.

- Housepoints and stickers can be used but no touching of any shared equipment / boards
- Exceptional work/behaviours will be rewarded by SLT in form of phone call home, written communication or mention in newsletter and/or through social media pages.

### **Sanctions**

Please adhere as the behaviour policy with the following exceptions

- Time outs will be arranged in separate areas so that there are no cross-bubble interactions.
- A member of the SLT, instead of phase leader to go to the child in their bubble
- If a child is refusing to come to the time out area, the Lead staff member from the group will take the rest of the bubble out of the room to a safe area (e.g. playground), where they will maintain social distancing and avoid mixing with another bubble. This will enable the SLT member to support the child (in a socially distanced way) until they are calm and able to reintegrate back into the group.
- Spitting, physical attacks, refusal to comply with H&S/ social distancing requirements that could heighten the risk of harm to others could result in our withdrawal of the offer of a school placement on a temporary basis, no longer than 14 days and will be decided by the Principal.

The SENDCo will work with class teachers to ensure that any individual behaviour plans have been adapted to include social distancing measures and reflect the risk assessment for re-opening.

If any adverse behaviours take place that could affect the health or safety of individual pupils or staff, then an individual risk assessment may be completed to review the safety of that child in school site during the pandemic restrictions.
