Reciprocity is one of the four R's we use when Building Learning Power. It shows we can work together well with others. This masterpiece is a whole school creation. WOW!



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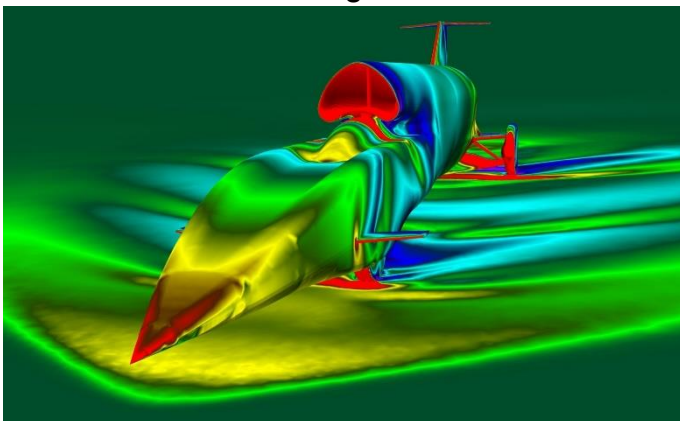


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## Sensational Science Day

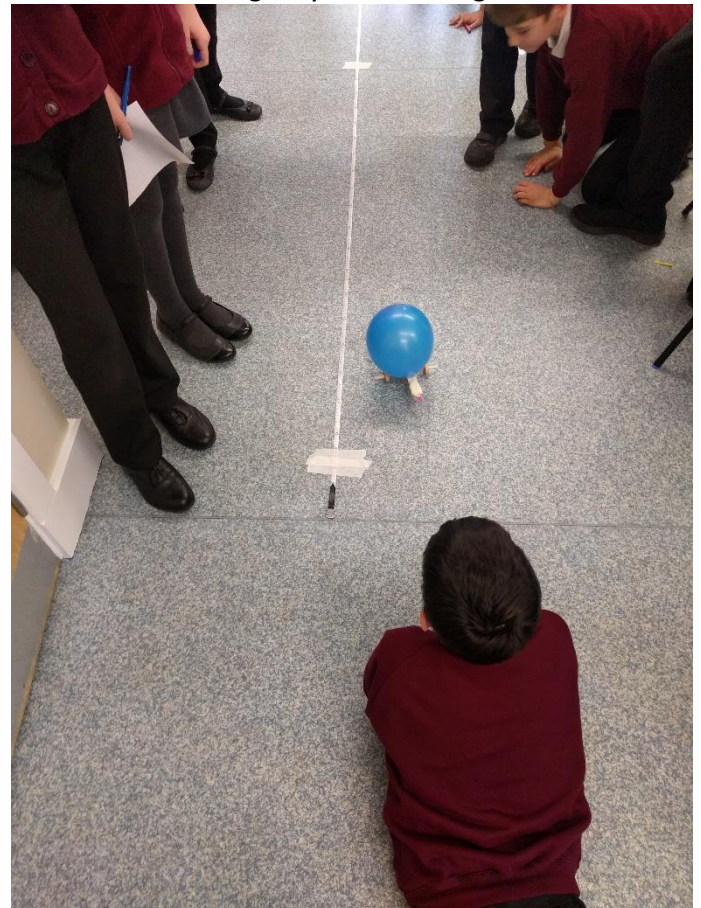
On Monday we held a sensational science day to help us prepare for The White Horse Federation Science Festival this coming week.
